Jerry AloK who volunteers with the Baltimore/Washington NWS Office is recruiting for a subnet coordinator for the Waynesboro/Charlottesville subnet, consisting of Albemarle, Augusta, Greene and Nelson counties. The main requirements for the coordinators job are SKYWARN Basic training (the NWS hopes to have an online class in May or June, depending on vacation schedules) and experience as net control of directed nets. ++Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES)++

After a slight delay for technical reasons, the League has released the first two of the new EmComm courses April 19. Basic EmComm is now required for what was formerly ARES Level 1, now known as "Basic Level" and Intermediate EmComm, will be required for what was Level 2 are live in the ARRL Learning Center now. With the new courses being released the legacy courses will be removed as the new ones are released. If you have previously completed EC-001 or EC-016, you will not have to

complete the newer courses. The League plans to have Advanced EmComm and ARES Leadership courses complete by early summer.

I highly recommend at least viewing the new courses as much has changed since EC-001 and EC-016 were originally published.

+++ARES May Report+++

The ARES Monthly Report continues to be sent out as a separate document. This goes both via the ARRL mailing list and to ARES Leadership for further distribution.

Remember, each hour is equivalent to our partner organizations spending \$33.38 in training an operator, and of course we provide the equipment as well, saving them even more.

+++ARES Leadership Updates+++

We have vacancies for throughout the Section for various positions. If you or someone you know would like to step up, we'd love to have them!

I will be distributing the link to the leadership directory to ARES leadership for review and update. This is what we and our partners use to contact each other if the need comes. Keep an eye out for it and directions.

Also, as you complete your ARES Position Task Books to Basic, Intermediate, or Advanced, let us know so we can get that information out as well. And keep an eye out for the updated Training Task Book. The levels have been renamed to better represent the level of training completed, and eliminate the confusion caused by the backwards numbering compared to the National Qualification System (NQS) standard, which places Level 1 as the highest level.

+++ARRL/ARES MOU with VDEM Update+++

The VDEM/ARRL of VA MOU is in the final approval stage and awaiting one more review/signature. As soon as that's completed, a copy will be circulated and we can begin the re-write of the VA ARES Emergency Operations Plan (EOP). One thing to remember with the EOP is that it does not replace or supersede any partner organizations' EOPs, but is available for when they do not have one to use, or to serve

as an annex to theirs, with joint approval. They are the "served" agency, and we are there to serve them.

+++Simulated Emergency Test (SET)+++

The ARRL has made a substantial change to the SET planning and execution that recognizes that many Sections may have real-world events occurring during the Fall window, and now allows for the scheduling and execution of the SET throughout the year. The annual SET report will remain in the September QST.

Steve KN4AOB, EC for Greene County works very closely with Greene County Office of Emergency Services, and began working on this year's Simulated Emergency Test (SET) as soon as they completed last year's. They're looking to make this into a District 2 event, and have requested that any groups looking to participate please let them know of what dates they're currently viewing. Traditionally the SET is the first full weekend in October (5 and 6 this year), but we realize that other groups may already have committed to other exercises near that time. Please let me and Steve know what you think would be good timing for you. Steve can be reached at s388bow AT gmail DOT com. If you're in another district and want to participate, chime in as well! I'll be reaching out to the VA VOAD and VDEM to get as much participation as possible from them as well.

+++Partner Sponsored Exercise+++

Greg KB4CFP is working on staffing for the annual Virginia Operations Plan Exercise (VOPEX) which encompasses several counties in Virginia. This is a critical test that is required annually to re-certify the safety and security of the nuclear facilities in Virginia.

From Greg, "Anyone that comes will have to fill out a Spotsylvania background check form and be cleared in advance.

I have staff for the EOC and staging area. Spotsylvania will also be running a Evacuation center. It is here where I will need additional help. I would like to have someone with an HT providing communications for each organization that will be working the center with the exception of the Sheriff's Office. I also want someone to shadow the director in charge of the center and a floater or two to provide bathroom breaks to those hams working with the organizations."
